Sweet Spring Flower

Violets are among the first flowers to bloom in the spring, offering cheer to all who see them.

The violet family has about 600 species, including pansies and violas, which are often sold as annual flowers, blooming for a single growing season. Many wild species of violets are perennials, popping up every year and spreading easily on lawns and in fields and forests. Most types of violets have green heart-shaped leaves and flowers made of five petals. Depending on the variety, some of the petals will point upward and some downward. As their name suggests, many violets are purple in color, but they also are found in shades of blue, white, yellow, orange, pink and red. Many are two-toned, with patterns that give the blossoms the look of a smiling face. The violet was a favorite of ancient Greeks, who used the flower for food, medicine and decoration. Violets are said to symbolize love, loyalty, nobility and humility. The flower's sweet fragrance has been a staple scent in the perfume industry. In cuisine, edible violet petals are sometimes used to garnish cakes and other desserts, and as an ingredient in salads and savory dishes.
